

Year 7 Catch Up Premium Grant Spending Action Plan Summary 2017-2018

The Department for Education has made available additional funds for improving the attainment of our disadvantaged pupils, known as the Year 7 Catch-Up Premium. The funds are primarily aimed at improving maths and English levels at Key Stage 3. Whilst the national expectation is that the catch-up premium should support pupils in moving to national expectations for their age, most of our eligible pupils were working towards age related expectations.

Pentland Field is committed to providing effective resources and ensuring vital support is in place for our pupils to improve their academic outcomes. This document details the proposed spend of the literacy and numeracy catch up funding for 2017/2018 and how we feel it will make a tangible contribution to the increased outcomes of all year 7 pupils in literacy and numeracy.

When evaluating the impact of the premium we therefore consider expected progress and the development of softer skills such as resilience and independent working which have a massive impact upon pupil progress throughout Key Stages 3 and 4.
