Year 7 Literacy and Numeracy Catch up Premium Awarded

How the catch up premium was spent:

The majority of the allowance was spent in developing the school's literacy programme for the newly formed secondary department. The school opened in January 2015 with a cohort of 32 pupils that were primary aged. It was important to develop the school's literacy programme that enabled both age-appropriateness and cognitive capacity to empower the pupils.

The school consulted with a number of providers but felt that the Oxford University Press - 'Read, Write Inc literacy and language programme was appropriate. Our initial approach led to further purchases of Read, Write In resources including the phonics scheme. The school also purchased another of the Oxford University Press's programmes, 'Project X'.

78% of students made at least expected progress in reading due to three successful initiatives introduced this year: Oxford Reading Tree, Read Write Inc., and our home/school reading scheme.
